Most of the time owners try to wean the foal in a way that causes the least amount of stress. Weaning is when you separate the foal from their mom also known as a dam. The reasoning of this is so that the foal can continue to grow up and receive training for the future. One of the most effective ways of doing this is by gradually separating the mom from the foal.

Puma and his mom moved to A&T together but then they kept his mom with him for too long this meant Puma was not weaned properly.
