Dr. Zoe Todd obtained her PhD in Social Anthropology from the University of Aberdeen in 2017. She is currently an Associate Professor (with tenure) in the Department of Sociology and Anthropology and School of Indigenous and Canadian Studies at Carleton University. Dr. Todd is an Indigenous scholar with expertise on Indigenous philosophy, environment, human-animal relations, decolonizing anthropology, Indigenous legal thinking, social theory, art, and community engagement. Previously she conducted research on Indigenous legal and environmental issues in the Western Canadian Arctic and her current research examines the contributions of Red River MŽtis legal traditions, cosmology, and philosophy to understanding and responding to emergent and urgent environmental crises in the Lake Winnipeg watershed, including social responses to the twinned challenges of the Anthropocene and the Global Extinction Crisis.

In her public presentation, Dr. Todd will discuss noteworthy, recent, and emerging developments in her field of expertise, and how she casts herself as a researcher, a research leader and teacher relative to the field. She will also discuss her application of the One Health approach in her research program, her research progressing in the next five years, and how her area of expertise supports and expands the capacity of the College's and a potential host department's research and teaching strengths.
