

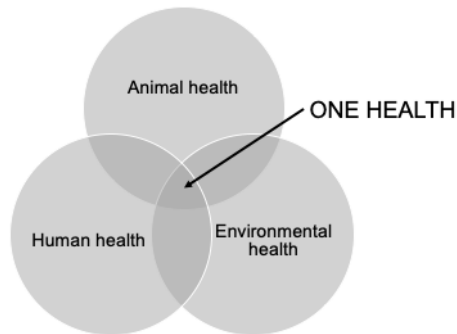
COLLABORATIVE SPECIALIZATION IN ONE HEALTH LETTER OF INTENT

Thank you for your interest in the Collaborative Specialization in One Health. As part of the admission procedure, we request a Letter of Intent. This letter provides you with an opportunity to illustrate how the Collaborative Specialization in One Health aligns with your primary area of research.

In the letter of intent, you should:

- 1) Briefly describe your interest in One Health and your rationale for completing the collaborative specialization,
- 2) Provide a brief overview of your proposed thesis research, and;
- 3) Clearly illustrate the potential alignment of your thesis research with a One Health Approach. You should explore the relevance of One Health in reference to your research. Please note, this does not specifically mean data collection. We encourage you to consider your thesis broadly and examine how the interconnectedness of health will be explored in one or more aspects of your research (e.g., literature review, data analyses, interpretation and relevance of research).

The letter of intent should be no longer than 500 words (excluding references, if needed).



As a guideline, One Health is defined as both a concept and an approach. As a concept, it speaks to the interconnectedness of the health of animals, humans and environments. As an approach, it involves working together across disciplines to combat complex health challenges that arise at the intersection of environment, human, and animal health¹. At the University of Guelph, our definition of the environment is comprehensive and includes natural environments, built environments and those that are socially constructed such as political,

financial and social environments.

Please submit your letter of intent via the posted Qualtric survey to the Graduate Program Coordinator by November 1. The survey is open each academic year from October 1 to November 1.
