FEAR BEHAVIOURS IN KITTENS

Kittens show some specific behaviours when they are fearful. Watch for things like ear, tail, and abdomen positions, motor activities, and other behavioural indicators.

> NOTE: These behaviours occur in combination with avoidance when a kitten backs or runs away from an object or stimulus



CROUCHED ABDOMEN

When a kitten's body is close to the ground with all four legs bent and their belly close to or touching the ground



TUCKED OR LOWERED TAIL

When a kitten tucks their tail under their body or wraps their tail around their hind legs



EARS BACK OR SIDEWAYS

When a kitten turns one or both ears backwards or sideways (think "airplane ears")



PILOERECTION

When a kitten raises the fur on their neck. shoulder, back and/or tail, giving a puffedup appearance (think "Halloween cat")



FREEZING

When a kitten freezes in place and is immobile with their body tensed for at least 2 seconds



SLOW MOVEMENTS

When a kitten walks slowly, more cowered and slower than normal, upright walking



FLINCHING

When a kitten suddenly jumps or jolts



AGGRESSION

When a kitten swats, bites, or hisses

POSITIVE OR NEUTRAL BEHAVIOURS IN KITTENS

Kittens show some specific behaviours when they are relaxed or in a neutral state.

Watch for things like ear, tail, and abdomen positions, and other behaviours like eating and grooming.

NOTE: These behaviours occur when kittens are in a positive or neutral state



NEUTRAL ABDOMEN

When a kitten holds their abdomen lifted from the ground with their legs naturally extended



UPRIGHT OR NEUTRAL TAIL

When a kitten holds their tail upwards, higher than the level of their back, or straight out behind them, in line with the level of their back



UPRIGHT EARS

When a kitten holds their ears upright at the front of their heard, directed and facing forward



EATING

Kittens eating may appear crouched and move their ears around, but the act of eating indicates kitten is relaxed



GROOMING

As with eating, kittens grooming themselves may appear crouched and move their ears around, but the act of grooming indicates the kitten is relaxed
