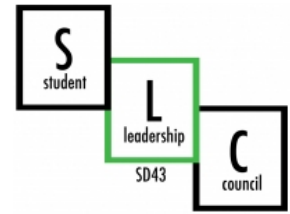

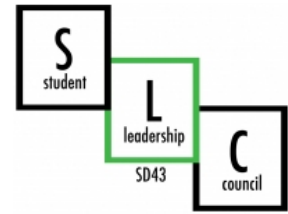

Cafeterias

- Middle school cafeteria cuts
 - schools facing financial deficits
 - trying not to impact education
- cafeterias actually cost money
- different cafeteria system to be introduced
 - 3rd party companies
 - not costing the district money

Vending Machines

- individual admin deciding where they come from
- with removal of cafeterias vending machines offer at least something for middle school students.

Healthy foods

- government decides what can and cannot be sold in schools
- restricted foods are still sold
- 3rd party companies will try and move towards healthier foods
- next fall: cafeterias are going to be very different

TOPIC Questions from the General Members

CONTENT

Q: What are you replacing pop with?

A: Depends on contractors, will be healthy though- fruit and water based drinks, sports drinks, etc.

Q: How will vending machine companies follow guidelines?

A: These companies are already on board with healthy guidelines

Q: Will schools be able to negotiate with contractors what products?

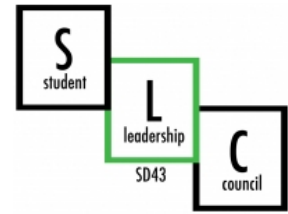
A: Yes. Also keep in mind that contractors want to make money, and they will stock high demand products

Q: Is the district eliminating entirely "junk food"?

A: The district should already be rid of "junk food." The new contracts will only allow contractors to sell healthy foods. There will obviously still be fundraisers with junk food (ex. bake sales)



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TOPIC Questions from the General Members (cont'd)

A: Healthy living is a part of the curriculum. Some sites (schools) do better. Examples in the district: early education, fruit and veggie programs, foods classes.

Q: How will the implementation of third party contractors affect in school culinary programs?

A: Teaching kitchens will remain in tact. The other high schools without teaching kitchens will bring in 3rd party companies to run their cafeterias.

CONTENT

Q: How much has the removal of of cafeterias affected the school district deficit?

A: \$180,000 went into Middle School cafeterias last year.

Q: Are we looking into newer food related technologies, as well as the actual product?

A: We don't have enough sales to justify spending money on these technologies. We would much rather using that money for education.

TOPIC Pamphlet and poster designs

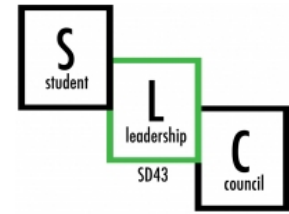
General members started to brainstorm ideas on designs for SLC pamphlets and posters to generate new members.
